

Wonder Woman Pumpkin Painting Instructions



Step 1: Get all of your supplies out of your kit. You'll need your pumpkin, Paint Brush, Sponge Brush, Paper Plate, Paper Towel, and the cup included in the kit.

Step 2: Fill your cup halfway with water.

Step 3: Pour about a dime sized amount of red and blue paint on your paper plate. Make sure you pour them far enough apart so they won't mix together.



Step 4: Using your sponge brush paint the top half of your pumpkin red.

Step 5: Rinse your sponge brush off in the cup of water and dab on the paper towel.

Step 6: Using your sponge brush paint the bottom half of your pumpkin blue.

Step 7: Let your pumpkin dry for 1 hour. Rinse your sponge brush off in the cup of water and dab on the paper towel. Set your sponge brush aside.

Step 8: After your red and blue paint has dried, pour about a dime sized amount of yellow paint on your paper plate. Make sure you pour it far enough from the red and blue paint so they won't mix together.

Step 9: Using your paint brush, paint a 2 inch thick line where your red and blue halves meet. Use the wonder woman crown at the bottom of this page to see about how thick 2 inches is.

Step 10: Rinse your paint brush off in the cup of water and dab on the paper towel.

Step 11: Let the yellow paint dry for about 30 minutes.



Step 12: After the yellow paint has dried, check to see it needs another coat of yellow. If so, go ahead and do a second coat of paint on the yellow line. If you do a second coat of yellow, don't forget to rinse your paint brush off and let the paint dry for about 30 minutes.



Step 13: Once the yellow line on your pumpkin is dry check to see if you need more red paint on your paper plate. If you need more red paint on your paper plate, pour another dime sized drop of red paint on your paper plate.



Step 14: Pull your sticky star template off the paper. Center your star template in the middle of the yellow line. The entire star should fit on the yellow line. If you have to re-adjust your star that is ok! If it pulls a little of your paint off that is ok, too! We can touch up the paint later.

Step 15: Once your sticky star template is on your pumpkin, use your paint brush and lightly paint red paint around the outside of the star. We already removed template in this picture, but it gives you the idea.



Step 16: Gently remove the sticky star template from the pumpkin. If it pulls off a little of the dried paint that is ok! We can fix it later! Remember to lay your template on a paper towel or put directly in the garbage can -- We don't want paint all over!



Step 17: With your red paint, fill in the rest of your star.

Step 18: If you need to touch up any areas where the sticky star template pulled paint up, go ahead and touch up. Don't forget to rinse your brush off before changing paint colors.

Step 19: Rinse your paint brush off in the cup of water and dab on the paper towel.
